

- equivalent, if they exhibit evidence of past achievements in non-academic areas indicative of an ability to succeed in law school.
- b. Indigenous applicants may be admitted with different incoming GPAs and LSAT scores from General applicants where the Committee considers that an Indigenous applicant is reasonably expected to complete the studies required leading to a law degree.
 - c. The Committee may consider Indigenous applicants' personal achievements, work experience contributions, or personal responsibilities or challenges that are extraordinary and would not typically be experiences by General applicants to the law school. Details are available from the Faculty of Law.
 - d. The Committee may make an offer of admission conditional on successful completion of preparatory program such as the Spring and Summer Law Course for Indigenous Students at the University of Saskatchewan.
 - e. The LSAT must be written as outlined in [General Admission Requirements \(4\)](#).

International Trained Lawyers Pathway Applicants

ITLP Students are permitted to register in one or more years of full-time study that are being taken to meet the requirements to be eligible to practice law in Canada and are not being taken for credit toward a degree or diploma at this or another institution. To be considered for admission as an ITLP Student, applicants must normally have received a Law degree from an accredited postsecondary institution, equivalent to a Canadian JD or LLB degree, must meet English Language proficiency, and must provide documentation setting out their assigned requirements as assessed by Canada's National Committee on Accreditation. Applicants from outside of Canada may meet their English Proficiency requirement based on the university they have attended or the country in which they reside. Some conditions apply. Where applicable, a minimum TOEFL iBT (Internet-based) score of 100 with a minimum of 25 in each section, a minimum Academic IELTS score of 7.0, with at least 5 on each band, a minimum Academic PTE score of 68, a minimum Duolingo English Test score of 130 with at least 105 in any subject, or the EAP 550 course is required. Since the Faculty of Law has limited enrolment, priority in admission is given to applicants to degree programs.

The application for admission as an ITLP student is available from the [Office of the Registrar](#). Any required documentation should be submitted directly to the Faculty of Law at: Admissions Office, Room 128E, Law Centre, University of Alberta, T6G 2H5. Applications will be received beginning March 1 each year and assessed in the order in which complete applications are received.

Application Procedure

The application for admission to the JD program is available from the [Undergraduate Admissions](#) website. The application must be submitted on or before December 1 of the year preceding the year in which admission is sought, unless a later deadline is specified on the [Faculty of Law website](#). All additional supporting documentation must be provided to the Faculty of Law on or before February 1 of the year in which admission is sought (see [Admission and Readmission Deadlines](#)).

All applicants will be notified by e-mail regarding admission or nonadmission. Successful applicants must confirm their admission and intention to register by submitting a nonrefundable deposit within the time specified in the letter of acceptance. The deposit will be credited toward tuition on registration in September (see [Program-specific Deposits on Confirmation of Admission](#)).

The Admissions Office will not accept enquiries concerning the status of applications. Applicants are encouraged to check the status of their application on [Bear Tracks](#).

Application Documentation

The following documents are required to complete an application and must be received by the application deadline in [Undergraduate Application Deadlines for Admission and Readmission](#).

1. **Transcripts:** Official transcripts of all postsecondary education are required. These transcripts must be complete and indicate any degree received. All transcripts must bear the seal of the issuing institution and the original signature of the issuing officer. Photocopies and transcripts without these marks of validity will not be accepted.
